COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT (CHNA) 2019-2021

We released the 2019 CHNA during fiscal year 2018-2019. The field period for the assessment survey was April 2, 2018, through June 29, 2018. Focus group discussions occurred between August 27 and 28, and a prioritization session took place on September 12, 2018. Representation included social service agencies, education, public service, business and industry, government, non-profit organizations, and health care related organizations from both Vanderburgh and Warrick County.

After reviewing the data, our collaborative identified four main health priorities for fiscal years 2019-2021:

EXAMPLES FROM OUR CHNA 2019 ACTION PLAN

Mental Health

Mental health specific education for primary care physicians related to:

- Signs and symptoms of common mental illnesses/conditions
- Recommended medications
- Appropriate referrals for treatment
- Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) and their relationship to future health

Substance Abuse

 Deaconess (The Women's Hospital) and St. Vincent Evansville (Hospital for Women and Children) will participate in the Indiana Perinatal Network's pilot program for perinatal substance use screening. The goal is to reduce the number of babies born with Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS).

Food Insecurity

- Use farmer's markets, pop-up markets, etc. to increase the availability of healthy food options in "healthy food priority areas" formerly called food deserts.
- With support from local partners, focus specific efforts on providing school-age children with nutritious food year-round.

Access to Care (Transportation)

- Identify or create safe, reliable transportation for those seeking medical services in Warrick County.
- Focus on the unique needs of residents in rural Warrick County
